

Impact of Sports Premium Funding

By using our £8677.00 Sports Premium money to employ a PE advisor(one day per week), sports coaches 11 hours at the school who works alongside the teaching staff and also buying into our local School Sports Partnership £750.00 this has allowed us to have a huge impact on our school sport.
